### Number and Income of Single Mother Family in Taiwan


### **Financial source:**

# **Employment Difficulty and Financial Crisis**

### Environmental causes

 The unfriendly labor market to single parents



### Unpaid housework

Child and family care

### Individual causes

- The psychological adjustment of being single parents
- The growth of age
- The lack of professional skills

Background

Overtime work yet low wage, insufficient income

High frequency of transferring jobs or career fields

Increasing frustration and individual loss

Financial crisis

Unable to accumulate assets



# Story of the Single Mother We Met: Yu-Zhu

- Profile:
  - 46 years old;
  - divorced;
  - a 10-year-old daughter.
- Living expenses:
  - Credit card debt: NT\$100,000
  - Rent: NT\$12,000/month
  - Utilities: ca. NT\$1,500/month
  - Meals (2 persons): NT\$6,000/month



# Story of the Single Mother We Met: Yu-Zhu

- Work experiences:
  - A part-time in a convenience store
    - 15:00 to 22:30, Feb. 2010 to Nov. 2011, 2 years
    - NT\$800/ day
    - neither labor insurance nor health insurance
  - A part-time of the governmental short-term employment plan for lowincome families
    - Dec. 2011 to Apr. 2012, 5 months
    - NT\$18,000/month
    - became unemployed again when the plan was terminated.



# Story of the Single Mother We Met: Yu-Zhu

### Situation:

- Was pressed for debt payment by banks
- Was anxious after unemployment
- Got women's diseases
- Conflict between her and her daughter

### Goals:

- To stop part-time job
- To stay with her daughter at night
- To deposit in banks



# Psychological Factors of the Single Mothers We Met

「我已經照顧孩子十年,不知道還有沒有人想要用我?」

「我去找工作都是等候通知,不想找了反正也找不到!」

「因為孩子最近一直發燒,老闆暗示我這樣其他人會很忙,我 不好意思就先辭職了。」





# Psychological Factors of the Single Mothers We Met

「居家打掃太累了,我要創業比較輕鬆。」

「社工我要來創業!因為我想要可以賺錢又可以照顧孩子,請 幫我申請貸款。」

To increase the stability of employment and start-up


To build the capacity to improve their financial ability

### Interviewing the mothers to understand

- Current situations
- Needs and expectations
- Histories of employment and entrepreneurship
- •The impact of single mother on her employment





Empowerment group



Tracking and outer resource provision

To evaluate the inner resources, advantages, the knowledge and the experiences of the single mothers and then choose the mothers who

### Had similar life experiences and history

- Was single parents
- Raised the children on her own
- Was faced with similar difficulties of employment and finance

### Had more capital and better abilities

- Stable job
- Owned the experience of start-up
- Succeeded in conquering the difficulties of escaping from poverty

to be the teachers of the empowerment group

Tracking and outer resource provision

To build the communication platform and the supportive group where mothers shared their stories

- 1. Experience events and single mother talks
- 2. Drawings of goals and dreams: the Tree of Dream





### 1. Experience events and single mother talks

- Experiences of choosing and entering the career, and the difficulties and breakthrough
- Experiences of start-up and keeping the family expenses at the same time

- To discuss, examine and utilize the surrounding resources.
- To set a concrete and reachable one-year goal
- To draw the "Tree of Dream"

Tracking and outer resource provision

To track the status of the mothers and provide services respectively

- 1. Decided to maintain the current job, not to start up
- 2. Kept curing depression and kept finding jobs at the same time
- 3. Found a part-time job, ran an online-store, handicraft teacher





### **Effects**

- 1. Breakthrough
- 2. Informal supportive group
- 3. Knowledge circulation
- 4. Resilience

# **Challenges and Development**

- To develop delicate services which reflect the variable needs
- 2. To keep the inner motivation of the mothers
- To harmonize the cooperation and competition between the mothers
- 4. To make the mother's capacity building status keep up with the real environment and career fields
